

Robert J. Glovsky Scholarship Fund Application

This Year's Deadline: September 30, 2024

The Robert J. Glovsky Scholarship Fund is a permanently endowed fund, the income of which shall provide annual scholarship awards to one or more students. Students must be enrolled in the Financial Planning Program at Metropolitan College's Center for Professional Education (CPE). Preference will be given to students who wish to assist traditionally underserved populations, whether through past experience, affiliation, and/or both. The selected student(s) will receive up to \$2,000 (no cash value) per year to reimburse tuition paid. Funds will be distributed after successful completion of each course per the conditions of the scholarship.

1. Eligibility

- Be enrolled in CPE's Program in Financial Planning and have successfully completed at least one course in the program (the application committee will not consider candidates who have not completed at least one class).
- Demonstrate evidence of past experience and/or affiliation with underserved populations
- Completed course(s) with a grade of B+ or better and maintain this grading standard to continue to receive the scholarship
- Have the intention to become a CFP® certificant by fulfilling all requirements and sitting for the CFP Board of Standards comprehensive certification examination
- Be willing to attend a certificate ceremony if living within 50 miles of the Boston University campus
- Be a United States citizen or permanent resident
- Plan to return to and/or continue in the workforce
- Cannot have received an FPA Certification merit-based scholarship within the previous 12 months of the application period

2. Requirements

- Submit a completed application, with answers to the three questions included
- Demonstrate past academic and/or professional accomplishment, e.g., degrees and honors received, and/or specific professional achievements
- Furnish résumé (including work experience, volunteer or community involvement, and educational achievements)
- Furnish one letter of professional recommendation (consider professors, instructors, CFP practitioners, etc.)
- Recipients should finish the required number of courses within three years of the scholarship application deadline
